Project Overview

In March 2021, the National Governors Association Center for Best Practices (NGA Center), in partnership with the Cognizant Foundation, launched the Workforce Innovation Fund and Workforce Innovation Network (NGA WIN) to help states respond to COVID-19 impacts on the labor market and help them improve employment and workforce outcomes.

The second round of grants from the Workforce Innovation Network will support technical assistance for a cohort of competitively-selected states to advance digital skill development for equitable economic participation in alignment with state workforce and economic development goals. The NGA Center will engage staff and subject matter experts to provide targeted technical assistance to Workforce Innovation Fund state grantees from November 2021 – June 2022.


Hawai'i's ultimate goal is to create **100% digitally literate workforce** that can continuously adapt as technology changes, and have the skills needed to support the changing job market.


