I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:31 p.m. by Committee Chair Ian Kitajima.

II. Review and discussion on recommendations by the Legislative Subcommittee as presented by Co-Chair David Miyashiro, HawaiiKidsCAN

David Miyashiro discussed legislative proposals, that were to be recommended to the Executive and Workforce Development Council board, should the committee approve the proposals. The included legislative proposals were:

- To provide funds to families to support with key educational supplies and needs.
- To provide incentive funds to schools when students complete quality industry recognized credential programs.
- To enable more students to participate in career readiness opportunities by removing barriers.
- To diversify the Hawaii Board of Education by updating the membership requirements.
- To enable the Hawaii Board of Education to let students earn school credits from community programs and organizations more easily.
- To request for the Hawaii Board of Education to enable computer science courses to count toward core graduation requirements in high school.
- To advance legislation that would require Hawaii Department of Health to produce a weekly public dashboard on the Hawaii Youth Trauma Indicators.

A motion was made by Maureen Bates to approve the proposed legislative recommendations to the Executive Committee and Workforce Development Council board. Melissa Gerber seconded the motion. There were no objections or abstentions. The motion to approve the recommendations was approved unanimously.
