






























### What We Do




















### **Discussion Topics**

#### ✓ PHNSY Dry Dock #5

- Great Opportunity to increase Navy dry dock Capacity
- Potential displacement of surface ship dry-dockings to West Coast of US
- Major impact to State's Ship Repair Industrial Base workforce
- ✓ Opportunity for State of Hawaii to tailor educational programs suited to maritime sectors and specifically to DoD work
  - Critical to maintaining key component of Hawaii's Industrial Base
  - Increase in work performed by Local Hawaii companies (Structural, mechanical, electrical)
  - Increased capacity of highly technical skills (fiber optics, elect / electronics, IT)
- ✓ Additional Navy Vessels planned for Pearl Harbor: DDG-51 & New DDG1000's coming to Hawaii
  - New skill set training opportunities
  - Increase in Ship Repair Industrial Base workforce needs
- ✓ Additional USCG Vessels planned for Hawaii: Medium Endurance Cutter & Buoy Tender
  - Additional work for commercial dry docks
  - Increase in Ship Repair Industrial Base workforce needs
