- During the last legislative session, additional state general funds were allocated and will be used for the internships and apprenticeships. A full-time staff member will be hired using the funds, although the bulk of the funds will be going to the stipends for the pay of the interns.
- Jarret also mentioned the digital literacy grant, which is being uses to fund in-person and virtual digital literacy courses. Another grant that was awarded, the Quest grant, will be used for internship to expand outreach for AJCs, digital literacy training courses.
- Mark Menard mentioned that there will be job fairs/hiring events every 5-6 weeks. The upcoming event is on October 11, 2022 at the Dole Cannery facility. Mark also mentioned the job fair on the 26th at Ke'ehi Lagoon.
