

## MAUI WILDFIRE DISASTER RECOVERY NATIONAL DISLOCATED WORKER GRANT

#### Summary

- Total award of \$21,062,640 to DLIR-WDD for two years Aug 26, 2023-Sept 30, 2024
- Emergency application submitted August 22, 2023
- Provides funding for 300 temporary employment to clean up and repair damage on Maui County caused by wildfires and provide humanitarian services related to needs created by the wildfires
- Partnering with Maui Economic Opportunity (MEO), Inc. to provide temporary employment with private agencies
- Workforce Development Division on Maui will provide temporary jobs with state agencies
- Supportive services may be available such as work clothes and tools, bus passes, child care, and relocation expenses; and training tuition or on-the-job training reimbursements to businesses who hire and train
- individualized assistance to help find other jobs and employment planning
