MINUTES

I. Call to Order and Welcome

Chair Ken Loui called the meeting to order at 9:00am. The purpose of the retreat was to convene members and brainstorm goals and action plans that can be incorporated into Workforce Council's Two-Year Strategic Plan. To give the board some background, Bennette Misalucha provided a short summary of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) and a brief history of Workforce Development Division (WDD) and Workforce Development Council (WDC).

Bennette Misalucha introduced Peter Adler, facilitator of the retreat, to the board.

II. Plan for the Day

III. Discussion #1 – Break-out groups

The board broke out into smaller groups of 4-6 members to identify potential "actionable" objectives and key measures for each of these goals

- WDC as Policy Advisor
- WDC as Convener
- WDC as Workforce Analyst
- WDC as Broker
- WDC as Community Voice
- WDC as Capacity Builder

After the small group sessions were completed, the board met as a group and went over each of the above. They noted priorities, and their feedback was compiled into a word document. IV. Group Discussion

The board reconvened after a short break to discuss the current committee structure, what can they do before December 31, 2025, what action plans they can take to achieve their goals.

V. Discussion by Committee

The board broke out into committees and discussed what their goals and action plans would be if they had a budget of \$50,000.

Sector Strategies and Career Pathways Committee would like to access sector needs and translate that into jobs that are needed. They would like to do consistent community outreach and prioritize identifying emerging or developing sectors to

connect business needs with available workforce.

Military and Veterans Affairs Committee suggested conducting a study that would specify how many transitioning service members want to stay in Hawaii, and what skills they need to find employment. They would also like to find gaps in the workforce and incentivize businesses to hire transitioning service members. Another priority was housing. The committee suggested re-purposing government facilities into affordable housing units. They also wanted to help spouses who were seeking employment. Some of the issues important to spouses are: flexible or hybrid hours, providing child care, fast-tracking certifications on licenses.

Performance Measures and Financial Accountability Committee listed recovery of funds and addressing the back log of Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) claims.

Special Projects Committee would like to identify workforce needs, focusing on recruitment and retention. They also stressed the importance of affordable housing. They would like to partner with the American Job Center (AJC), Good Jobs Hawaii, and One-Stop operators to do outreach. They would also like to add more staff to the Workforce Development Council.

Employer Engagement Committee emphasized apprenticeship programs and updating policies and incentives to make it easier to hire graduates of these programs.
