

- HI CAN highlights career pathways for jobseekers that are highly likely to:
 - ✓ Boost their earnings
 - ✓ Leverage their existing skills
 - ✓ Identify in-demand careers with openings in the current market.
- HI CAN also supports UI Work Search Functionality and Referral to Benefits and other supportive services that jobseekers may need while exploring new career opportunities.
