To better understand the landscape, the Youth Services Committee invited various youth-focused organizations at its April 22, 2024 meeting to present their particular focus and initiatives.

At this June 21, 2024 meeting, the same organizations will be convened for a roundtable discussion.

The goal is to discern future steps to create career pathways to youth, especially those with barriers to employment.

These are the questions which will be disseminated and will be up for discussion:

- 1. What are the primary barriers to employment that at-risk youth in our community face, and how do these barriers vary among different subgroups (e.g., age, gender, ethnicity)?
 - o **Follow-up:** Are there specific skills or resources that are most lacking among these groups?
- 2. What successful strategies or programs have you implemented to overcome these barriers, and what outcomes have you observed?
 - Follow-up: Can you provide specific examples or case studies of youth who have benefited from these strategies?
- 3. How do you collaborate with other organizations, educational institutions, and employers to create pathways to employment for at-risk youth?
 - **Follow-up:** What challenges do you face in these collaborations, and how have you addressed them?
- 4. What role do mental health and social support services play in your workforce development programs for at-risk youth, and how do you integrate these services?
 - o **Follow-up:** What additional support services do you think are necessary to enhance the effectiveness of workforce development initiatives?
- 5. How do you measure the success and impact of your programs on at-risk youth, and what metrics do you use to evaluate their progress toward employment?
 - o **Follow-up:** What have been your key findings from these evaluations, and how have they informed your program adjustments?
- 6. What gaps do you see in the current workforce development efforts for at-risk youth, and what recommendations would you make to address these gaps?
 - Follow-up: How can our committee support and enhance your efforts to fill these gaps?
