Artificial Intelligence (AI)

Hawaii P-20 Partnership for Education is part of the UH system and is tasked to work with the State Department of Education and the University of Hawaii Systems to strengthen the education pipeline from kindergarten to high schools. It also administers the federal program called Perkins V.

Perkins V is also known as the "Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century" law. It is a federal education program that invests in Career and Technical Education for secondary, post-secondary and adults.

The presentation will cover Hawaii's data on the status of the federal program.
