**WHEREAS**, apprenticeships are unique, long-term training programs that allow job seekers to learn specialized skills for various trades, combining classroom instruction with on-the-job training; and

**WHEREAS**, apprenticeship programs tap into a wider pool of talent, including people with disabilities, veterans, women and minorities; and

**WHEREAS**, Hawai'i has 67 apprenticeship programs in both construction and non-construction trades such as healthcare and information technology; and

**WHEREAS**, Hawai'i Apprenticeship Week promotes awareness on apprenticeship programs that will provide Hawai'i's workforce with pathways to start new careers; and

**WHEREAS**, activities for Hawai'i Apprenticeship Week includes Construction Career Day in Hilo and Maui that showcase careers in the construction industry to high school students and instructors; and


**WHEREAS**, Honolulu Community College will release a video highlighting apprentice success stories on the State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations website during Apprenticeship Week;
