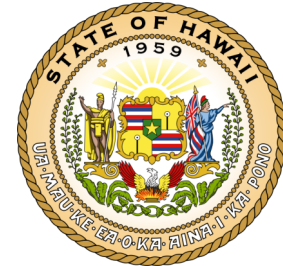

What is ETF?

The Employment and Training Fund (ETF) program was established by the Hawaii State Legislature in 1991.

The program's purpose is to enhance business growth and improve the long-term employability of Hawaii's people through grant offerings.

The ETF provides grants to Hawaii businesses with the opportunity to upgrade the skills of their workforce from entry-level to top management.

Since its inception, thousands of individuals have been trained through the ETF Program.

Employer Referral

Employers can refer their employees to existing non-credit, short-term training courses offered by a variety of ETF training providers.

ETF will provide 50% tuition assistance, up to \$400.

Employers must pay the remaining excess balance thereof directly to training provider.

Eligibility Requirements

Participants must be currently employed by a non-government entity.

Requested training must be ETF-approved, upgrading the skills of the participant's current position, and provided by one of the approved ETF Training Providers .

ETF cannot be used to fund training that supplants or duplicates existing training activities or training that is required by federal, state or county statutes.

How to Apply

Check out our list of approved ETF training providers and consult with them on course availability, scheduling and any other questions you may have.

Complete the Employer Referral Agreement Form and submit to your Hawai'i State Workforce Development Division Local Office at least two weeks prior to the start date of the class.
