ABOUT

The Workforce Development Division's (WDD) Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker (MSFW) Outreach Program collaborates with community-based organizations (National Farmworker Jobs Program) to offer the full range of employment services to agricultural employers and farmworkers.

The MSFW Outreach Staff assist farmworkers who otherwise would not have access to services provided at with the American Job Center (AJC) on each of the four major islands. Outreach services are designed to be conducted where they work, live, and gather to ensure farmworkers receive equitable and timely services.

The MSFW Outreach Staff provide information to farmworkers at no cost, including available workforce development services, labor law protection resources, Unemployment and State Disability benefits, and support services.

Information on employment resources, worker rights, job referrals and support services available through the WDD and its partners is also provided.



Who are MSFW'S?

An individual may be classified as a type of worker for the MSFW program if they meet the following:

• Migrant Agricultural Worker is anyone employed in agriculture or food processing on a temporary basis and is required by his/her work to be absent overnight from his/her permanent place of residence.

• Seasonal Agricultural Worker is anyone employed in agriculture that is seasonal or temporary and not required by his/her work to be absent overnight from his/her permanent place of residence.



Services for MSFW'S

- Referrals to Education and Training (GED, ESL, Non-credit and other jobrelated certifications)
- Support services (transportation, work tools and clothing, equipment, housing, childcare)
- Information on Unemployment Insurance and Disability Insurance, and Department of Human Services support services.
- Information and assistance with Employment Services and Labor Law related Complaints.
- Information on state and federal farmworker employment rights.
- Referrals to agricultural job opportunities (H-2A program).
- Assistance with job search and coaching, job screening, resume writing, and referrals to jobs.
- Assistance with registering in HireNet Hawaii and HICAN.
- Information on Job Fairs and workshops at the American Job Centers on each of the islands.
- Access to computers, printers, scanners, and copiers.
- Multilingual assistance.
